THREE PLUS TWO MAKES FIVE!

Before leaving the USA I prayed, "Lord ... send us two Team members to replace Rosalind and Kevin (who cancelled at the last minute) ..."

Now, one friend thought I was crazy, "How can you get MORE Team members when you are leaving tomorrow?" It didn't make any sense, I know.

It was Thursday, our last morning at Mayfield Guest House in Nairobi, a young man brought the morning devotions at breakfast -- Tim Smith. "My wife Nicky and I are not attached to any mission ... we are from England and on a 6 month pilgrimage in Africa to see if it is God's will to serve him here..."

This is practically unheard of -- ALL missionaries passing through Mayfield are 'attached' to a mission of some sort. They are either coming from it or going to it.

After breakfast the Team and I introduced ourselves to Tim and Nicky. Daniel had said earlier he'd spent a wonderful hour with this amazing couple the day before. We invited them to join our Team in Kitale. Later we walked into the nearby Harlingham shopping district to draw money from the ATM.

Pastor Timothy arrived with the 'Matato' (small bus) about 9 am. We told him our exciting news and he was so happy. Tim and Nicky promised to join us after they took care of a commitment or two in Nairobi.

The Matato was so full that Daniel and some of the luggage didn't fit on, so he and Pastor Timothy caught another lift and followed us later on. Nicky and Tim joined us on Saturday, two days later.

Wow. I really have nothing else to say! When asked to write about my trip so far I really have no idea where to start. I wish I had time (and the patience) to write everything down but obviously I can't. The people here are absolutely amazing. Their faith and their dedication inspire me! Pastor Timothy puts it this way: "It is a blessing to be born into poverty because we (the Kenyan people) then have a reason to look to God."
