Subject: TWO SPECIAL PRAYER REQUESTS: SOUTH SUDAN SECURITY & KENYA/SOMALIA FAMINE

Dear Family & Friends of the Persecuted Church,

Here are two urgent, timely PRAYER REQUESTS that directly affect our ministry in KENYA AND SOUTH SUDAN:

1. KENYA (from Mission Network News).



Since famine struck East Africa, the world's largest refugee camp has literally been overflowing. The **Dadaab Refugee Camp** in northern Kenya is actually three camps. Each one was meant to hold about 30,000 people. At this point in time, each camp has more than four times that capacity, well over 100,000 people.

5,000 people pour into Dadaab each week, mostly from Somalia. With no space left, starving people are forced to live on the camp perimeter. The structure and organization that existed in the past has been replaced by chaos of trying to help.

Note: Humanitarian workers entering Somalia to take aid to the drought victims are killed by rebels and their supplies confiscated. Therefore the refugees can only be helped after they leave Somalia to enter neighboring Kenya.

Pray for ministries working in this camp and other Refugee Camps as they shine Christ's love to a hopeless group of people.

2. SOUTH SUDAN.

The letter below just arrived from **James Keah**, our **Sudanese Field Director**. Please pray as I am busy preparing to enter South Sudan this week. My agenda takes me to a few of the areas mentioned below.

Dear Mama Charlotte, Sunday Aug 21, 2011

"This is to give you the Security Situation ...

1. "August 17. There was a number of security threats in Greater Upper Nile. The Murle tribe attacked in Urror county, a village called Pieri, killing 1,100. The majority were women and children.

They burned huts to ashes and the community is in a desperate situation. This caused a huge displacement.

2. "August 19. A landmine killed 21 people in Unity State (where our mission compound is located). The majority were women and children who were traveling on a commercial bus. UNIDO (Bush Telegraph's partner) took our medical team to Bentieu from Boar where we support three health care facilities.

"The incident happened in the area we support and therefore the UN soldiers closed in on the same area.

3. "August 21. Fighting erupted in Upper Nile State. Five people were killed including a World Vision boat driver.

4. "Lake State has been going through massive insecurity, however, it is calm now.

5. "In Western Equatoria, the village of Yambio raised fears as they heard rumors of the LRA (Lord's Resistance Army, a vicious rebel group) coming down to Yambio.

6. "The road from Leer to Bentieu (our mission's area) is been closed by the UN Security soldiers. I will be driving from Leer to Bentieu tomorrow, Tuesday, August 23. Indeed John Kong and our driver will also be with me.

"Please ask our Prayer Partners in America to pray for all these situations."
